


### e.RISEBA (Moodle) User Guide for Students


# I First Steps in the e.RISEBA System

e.RISEBA is an electronic learning environment available on the Moodle platform.


You can access the study environment by visiting https://e.riseba.lv or through the RISEBA homepage.

On the homepage, before logging in, you have the option to watch a video to learn more about RISEBA. Below, you will find information about available resources, tools, and opportunities during your studies. At the bottom of the page, there is a shortcut to download the <u>Moodle mobile app</u>.






- 1. Go to: https://e.riseba.lv

3. Enter your username and password, then click "Log in"





#### The Dashboard section

After logging into the system, you will be directed to the Dashboard section.


In the main area, you will see a calendar displaying upcoming events and assessments. Below that, you'll find your recently accessed courses, as well as a timeline showing upcoming assignments and deadlines. From here, you can also access and complete an assessment, if the lecturer has enabled access to it.

On the right-hand side panel, you will find the course navigation block, private files section, upcoming events, and a list of students and lecturers who are currently online.



# The My Courses section

- 4. By clicking on the *My Courses* section, a page will open where you can see the courses assigned to you for the current semester.
- 5. To open a specific course, click on the course image or title.



### Course Page

At the top of the course page, you will see the name of the programme and the study course, the course credit value, the lecturer's name and contact information, as well as the Course description prepared by the lecturer. It contains information about the course content, independent works, assessments, and other useful details.

Below that, the instructor has uploaded the studying materials and assessments related to the course.

- Materials (Resources): These may include downloadable files and presentations, lecturer's videos, links to external resources, and more.
- Activities: Tasks (often used as assessments) planned by the lecturer for submission via the Moodle platform, online tests, or other interactive elements.

Each type of resource or activity has its own icon. Some of them are shown below.
